After learning that I was **diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma**, I was **directed to Dr. Tierney** who recommended **Poly-MVA**. I used Poly-MVA during my time of **treatment of chemotherapy**.

I was assured the **Poly-MVA would not interfere** with the chemo treatments. During this time of **chemo treatments every three weeks** of six treatments my **blood counts always remained high enough**, so I never had to miss a treatment.

I never had any **side effect of nausea, tiredness, etc.** I work two days per week and I was able to work and never missed any days. **I finished my treatments the end of December 2009**. I've gone every three months for checkups and **so far everything has been good**.
